Attendance

There is a clear correlation between *good attendance* and *good outcomes* at school. Children need to be in school to learn well. Any child who has attendance below 95% is highlighted as a possible concern. The school will then track attendance over the next term, contact parents to discuss concerns or call a meeting to discuss possible issues and offer support if needed.

In severe cases, where the attendance continues to be low, the EWO can be called in to work with the family.

Requests for holidays in term time will not be authorised unless there are very exceptional circumstances.
