	<i>Carnivore</i>	An animal that eats meat.
	<i>Omnivore</i>	An animal that eats plants and other animals.
	<i>Museum</i>	A building where old and often important objects are displayed.
	<i>Palaeontologist</i>	A scientist who studies fossils.
	<i>Jurassic</i>	A period of time over 190 million years ago.

Mary Anning Timeline

- On May 21st 1799 Mary was born in Lyme Regis, England.
- 1811 Mary discovered a skeleton belonging to a dinosaur!
- 1823 Mary discovered the first Plesiosaurus Skeleton.
- 1828 Mary discovered the first Pterodactylus.
- 1847 Mary died aged 47.
